



What are the New Zealand Open Source Awards

The New Zealand Open Source Awards recognise and celebrate the outstanding work done with free and open source software and the artistic, scientific, and social outcomes it delivers in New Zealand. The awards in 2021 will look at the best of these successes over the past three years.

For New Zealand, free and open source technologies not only represents an opportunity to contribute and be recognised on the world stage, but also to deliver real competitive advantage. Encouraging collaboration, openness, honesty and transparency allows for more effective tools and software to evolve, helping people, communities, and organisations to meet the challenges they face.

The New Zealand Open Source Awards recognise and promote:

- the direct contributions of individuals to free and open source projects, or the promotion of free and open source philosophy.
- exemplary use of free and open source by New Zealand organisations.

Award Process

The NZOSA are split into seven categories, with nominations for the awards made by the open source community, including businesses, government agencies, individuals, community groups and more. A panel of judges, known figures within the open source community, consider all nominations and select the finalists for each category. All finalists are invited to attend the awards gala dinner where the winners are announced.

The judges also select a number of nominations, which become the finalists in the People's Choice category.

Awards categories

Open Source Use in Government	For the outstanding use of free and open source in the public sector in New Zealand.
Open Source Use in Business	For the outstanding use of free and open source in the private sector in New Zealand.
Open Source Software Project	Recognises the free and open source software project that has made the biggest positive impact for New Zealanders in the past two years.
Open Source Contributor	Recognises the outstanding contributions by a New Zealand individual or organisation to one or more free and open source projects.
Open Source in Education, Social Services and Youth	For the outstanding use of free and open source in education, social services, charities, youth and community organisations.
Open Source use in Science	Recognises the outstanding use of free and open source software to make scientific research and data accessible to all.
Open Source use in the Arts	For the outstanding use of free and open source for creative endeavours and the arts in New Zealand.
